On behalf of the only province-wide voice for community-based peer support organizations (PSOs) and Community Survivor Initiatives (CSIs) in Ontario’s Mental Health & Addictions (MH&A) sector, the Ontario Peer Development Initiative (OPDI) wishes to congratulate you on your recent appointment as Minister of Health and Deputy Premier. We are excited for you to take on this challenging role, and wish you all the best in the upcoming mandate.

As you may know, OPDI represents a network of over 50 PSOs and CSIs across the province. These organizations are unique community assets that run in parallel with, and in-support of clinical peer support programs. The profile of these organizations, and particularly the “drop-in” nature of their programming, allows them to effectively fill the gap in care where it is needed. Some highlights of our segment include:

- Operating independently of the formal mental health system by a board made up exclusively of consumer/survivors;
- Non-discriminatory in its service offering, by welcoming people who have not been accepted into the formal mental health and addictions system and those who are sleeping rough;
- Providing a warm alternative to hospitalization, crisis services, increased medication (all of which reduce Ontario’s healthcare costs); and
- Offering pathways to employment and training opportunities for those looking to return to the community but have been suffering from mental health afflictions (e.g. [A-Way Express](#)).


